Millésime 2018

- James Suckling – novembre 2022 – 92

« Pure cassis, chili chocolate and a hint of cigar box and dark olives. A fruit-forward and medium-bodied Margaux on the palate that shows excellent finesse with tight yet silky tannins and juicy berry fruit. Effortlessly drinkable at this early stage. Enjoy now or hold. »

An array of blackcurrants and blueberries with some violets, walnuts and leather. Very juicy and vibrant on the palate with medium body and velvety tannins. Soft and polished. Cabernet sauvignon, merlot and petit verdot. Delicious now.

Millésime 2020

« The 2020 Cuvée 1762 is a new wine from the estate. Silky and nuanced, the 1762 is beautifully lifted, with a host of floral and mineral accents that lend vibrancy throughout. Here the flavor profile is decidedly red fruit-leaning. This elegant, super-refined Margaux is all class. Drink 2025-2036 »

“Gorgeous aromatics on the nose: violets, roses, potpourri, so scented and inviting. Smooth and sleek, refined and excellent weight on the palate. Tannins are there and they coat the mouth but with a fine, crushed and elevated texture supporting the blue fruits and blackcurrants. There's a lovely coolness, it doesn't feel too heady, overripe or hot. Elegant, still with lots of flavour and energy on the palate. Really driving from start to finish. It's lighter than some, for sure, but there's so much to like. Crushed stones on the finish. »

« Open and perfumed nose of nutmeg, black cherries, plums and dried flowers. Some chocolate orange. It's medium-bodied with lightly grainy tannins and fresh acidity. Zesty and fresh. Drink in 2024. »

“The 2020 Château Marquis De Terme Cuvée 1762 is a tribute to the 260 years of the vineyard and, as such, is a selection from each of the 26 parcels of the site. A blend of 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 31% Merlot, and the rest Petit Verdot, it has an elegant, medium to full-bodied, pretty style as well as plenty of classic red and blue fruit, some tobacco and violet notes, supple tannins, and lots of up-front charm. It's going to drink nicely for a decade or more.”

- **Giorgie Hindle / Decanter – Janvier 2025 – 93**

“A new cuvée in homage to the year the estate was founded. Rich aromatics, spiced blackcurrant and soft sticky liquorice aromas. Juicy and lively, this is focussed on clarity and precision of the red berry fruit with racy acidity and super fine tannins. Feels extremely likeable with dried herbs, hints of tobacco, espresso, cocoa and mint on the finish. A subtle take on 2022 in terms of texture and ripeness of fruit with a silky mouthfeel and long, mentholated finish. Really excellent. »

“Hawthorn, plums, baked berries and a twist of wet leaves on the fruity nose. Chewy and packed, with a medium body and a tight-grained finish. Drink from 2027.”

Millésime 2023

- **James Suckling – Novembre 2025 - 92**

“A very attractive, subtly herbal nose of dried flowers, elderberries and bay leaves. The succulent yet delicate palate shows expressive, crunchy dark fruit, linear acidity and fine tannins. Better in a year or two. »

« Les notes florales présentes mettent la fraîcheur du bouquet en évidence, qui affiche également des nuances d'élevage. En bouche, le vin se révèle de manière linéaire, mais également monochrome. Il peine à mettre en valeur les différents éléments le constituant. On ressent bien l'extraction et les tannins en résultant. Un passage en cave va certainement permettre à l'ensemble de s'épanouir et se révéler. »

Millésime 2025 (primeur)

- **Jeff Leve – Avril 2026 (primeur) - 90**

“Black cherries, chocolate, and flowers greet you in the nose. The medium-bodied, round-textured palate is sweet, juicy and fruity, with accents of dark chocolate, spice, and licorice. Produced in an open style, this is perfect for early drinking pleasure. The wine blends 50% Merlot with 50% Cabernet Sauvignon. Drink from 2027-2035.”
